

## PART –A

### PLAN OF ACTION

- 17) **Community Services:**

**22) Courses in which student assessment of teachers is introduced and the action taken on student feedback:**

Teachers lacking in some areas were sent for the training in the respective disciplines to compensate the deficiencies. They are also well guided by their senior colleagues to over come the lacuna through corrective and remedial measurers.

**24) Computerization of Administration and the Process of Admission and Examination Results, Issue of Certificates:**

The concept of 'paperless administration' and 'paperless office' is widely popular today. Application of computers in College office administration has become a must. The college has taken drastic steps to computerize each and every aspect of the College administration. As a result the work is carried on quite smoothly.

Admissions of students at our College for various courses is done strictly according to norms prescribed by the Government of Karnataka. If the number of applications increases for a particular subject or the number of applicants hikes with an overwhelming response, the college arranges for written tests and viva for the students to trace out the actual eligibility. Preference is also given to outstanding sportsmen and to the students with track-records in cultural talents and NCC with 'B' grade certificates. A special provision for admission is made for the physically challenged.

Tests and Examinations are conducted meticulously with a special schedule within a stipulated time. The valued answer papers are shown to the students and later preserved in the College safe. Marks are consolidated and results are announced within the framework of time.

Various certificates required by the students, are issued by the office according to a particular procedure. The student is expected to submit an application requesting for the issue of the certificates. After a through verification of the application concerned, the certificate is issued to the student.

**25) Increase in the Infrastructural Facilities:**

As per the previous proposed plan, new science laboratories have been constructed. Two Microbiology and two Biotechnology-totally four Science Laboratories are already functioning now. These are well equipped laboratories catering to the needs of the students of these two disciplines.

Maintenance of a huge College building is a herculean task. This has been very well planned. The existing classrooms are maintained well with minor repairs. Some classrooms are refurnished. The entire College building is elegantly painted.

**26) Technology Upgradation:**

Up-gradation of technology becomes imperative for smooth functioning of a huge institution. Computerization in the college administration is playing a crucial role. As the old computers have become obsolete, they have been replaced by the upgraded 'P4 Computers'. New laboratory equipments have been purchased for the Department of Physics, Chemistry, Microbiology and biotechnology Digital balances are also purchased for the laboratories.

**27) Computer and Internet Access and Training to Teachers and Students:**

The knowledge of computers and their operation has become quite inevitable for the student-community. Hence, computers are compulsorily introduced in all the programmes of studies at our college. The college library processes fast tracking internet access for the benefit of students and staff. Teachers and the administrative officials are trained in operating computers efficiently. Computer training and orientation programmes are conducted from time-to-time to update the process.

**28) Financial Aid to the Students:**

Some students have very weak financial background. This factor often hampers the progressive process of education. The college has formulated different schemes to offer financial aid to the deserving students. The aid is sanctioned on the basis of merit, economic backwardness and to SC/ST category students.

An effective interaction between parents and teachers enhances the excellence of education and overcomes the problems that might impede the process of progress. The college has made a provision for Parent-Teacher interaction and meetings. Such interaction-meetings are arranged from time to time. The students problems are sorted out and suitable remedies are suggested and implemented. They review, update and upgrade the students welfare programmes. The updated report of the performance of the students is sent to the parents by post for their kind verification and perusal.

**31) Health Services:**

Educational institutions are expected to be health-conscious. Fitness of the body and mind very much influences the academic progress of the student. Our college has made apt and appreciable arrangements to take care of the health of the students and staff.

There is an exclusive Health Centre maintained by the College to facilitate the medical services promptly and timely. The centre takes up a routine medical check up of the students and maintains an up-to-date record. A registered medical practitioner attends to the students each academic year and advises them on their health. A dental check up of the students by a doctors of our own college is taken up is always available for the medical service on the college campus from 9 am to 5 pm.

### 32) Performance in Sports Activities:

The physical development of students and their health is of paramount importance. Coaching and Training in sports and games not only equips them with specialized skills in different events but also keeps them fit and fine brimming with a rare joy and enthusiasm.
