The college is affiliated to Karnatak University, Dharwad. During the academic year 2004-05, it has been accredited ‘A’ Grade by NAAC.

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution.

The chief goal for any institution is to advise academic excellence. This goal is achieved through a meticulously designed strategy in teaching learning process. A sincere effort of qualified experienced and dedicated teachers will help to take the institution to the peak of popularity.

Besides excellence in academics the institution has well defined network for extra curricular activities. Which aims at creating healthy citizens with leadership qualities.

2. New academic programs initiated (UG/PG)

Karnatak University, Dharwad has given an approval to start a Post Graduation course in English in our college. The Course is started from 2007-08. In this academic year 10 students were admitted for 1st year M.A. in English.

Further, necessary documents were forwarded to Karnatak University, Dharwad to start PGDCA Course in our college. Consequently LIC from Karnatak University, Dharwad paid visit to the college and gave a positive report to begin PGDCA Course from the coming academic year.

3. Innovations in curricular design and transactions.

The teaching faculty of our college recognized the significance of lesson plans in teaching learning process. Hence it was effectively implemented in all subjects.

Conducting seminars is a regular features which greatly enhance the stage courage among the students and also improves their communication skills. The teachers of our college from all disciplines have prepared question banks from I to VI semesters in the respective subjects which help the students to achieve excellence in exams. Power point presentations in subjects like Environmental Studies, Botany, Chemistry, Physics, etc have helped the student community to grasp the subjects in detail.

4. Inter disciplinary program started

The courses like Paramedical, Dental Mechanics, MLTC, Microbiology, Bio-technology are involving the inter disciplinary programs in which the Chemistry and Physics teachers of our college are teaching for Paramedical and Dental Mechanics students coming from Medical and Dental Colleges. Botany, Zoology and Chemistry teachers are teaching for the courses of Micro-biology and Bio-technology. An UGC Sponsored Add-on course MLTC has been started from this academic year for which Physiology and Anatomy Professors of Medical College were involved in teaching under an MOU with SDM Medical and Dental College, Dharwad.

Similarly the teachers of Political Science are engaged in teaching in Indian Constitution, Human Rights and Personality Development which are compulsory subjects introduced at the Under Graduates level. Further, teachers from Botany and Zoology department are engaging Environmental Studies which is another compulsory subjects for the degree students.

5. Examination Reforms Implemented

To maintain quality & excellence in education examination reforms gain vital prominence. Regularly two internal tests and preparatory examinations were conducted in each semester. Similarly practical tests are also conducted in subjects with practical. This process facilitates the teacher to evaluate the students continuously and further to improve their performance in Annual Exams. Apart from this the Viva-voice tests were also conducted in subjects with practicals to gain the confidence among the students in communication skills. Further the results of the Test and preparatory exams were notified to the student and also brought to the notice of their parents.

Remedial Classes are conducted for under performed students to cope up with the advanced learners.

7. Initiative towards faculty development Program:

18. Community Services:

25. Computerization of administration and the process of admissions and examination results, issue of Certificates:

The College has taken drastic steps towards computerization of each and every aspects of the computerization. An admission of students at our college for various courses is done strictly according to norms prescribed by the Government of Karnataka. If the number of applications received for the admission of a particular course increases then the college arranges for written test and viva for the students to trace out the actual eligibility. Preference is also given to outstanding sportsmen and to the students with track records in the cultural talents and students with 'B' Certificate in NCC. A special provision for admission is made for the physically challenged candidates.

Tests and Examinations are conducted regularly as per the requirements of the Karnatak University, Dharwad. The Valued Answer Papers are shown to the students and later preserved in the college safely. Marks are consolidated and results are announced with in the stipulated time.

The college is affiliated to Karnatak University, Dharwad therefore degree certificates and passing certificates are issued by the University. However, college issues certain certificates on demand like Study Certificates and Character Certificates.

As and when the computers become obsolete, they have been replaced by the computers with latest configuration. New laboratory equipments have been purchased for the Department of Physics, Chemistry, Micro-biology, Bio-technology, Botany and Zoology.

28. Computer and Internet access and training to teachers and students:

Computer Courses have become an integral part of the curriculum design. Hence, computers were compulsorily introduced in all the programs of studies in our college. The college library possesses broad-band Internet access for the benefit of the students and the staff. Computer training and orientation programmes are conducted regularly.

29. Financial Aid to the Students :

Apart from availability of various freship and scholarship facilities from the government, the students are given financial assistance through number of prizes and scholarships. To encourage the students Management gives scholarships for bright students and sportsman. Apart from this, aluminies as well as philanthropists have installed various scholarships and cash prizes to encourage the meritorious and out standing students both in academic and extra curricular activities.

30. Support from the Alumni Association and its activities:

There is an active Alumni Association in the college which stands by the progress and development of this institution. Many of the alumni's have donated Books, Desks, Furnitures, Cupboards, Computers, Lap-tops to the institution in addition to the donations in the form of cash.

31. Support from the parent – teacher Association and its activities :

Under the provision of Parent–Teacher Association, the college conducts regular meetings of the parents where all the teachers participate interacting with the parents to know the problems of the students and the solutions suggested from the parents. The progress report of the students is sent regularly to the parents by post. Wherever necessary counseling is done for the students who are under performed through mentorship committee.

32. Health Services :

Our institution is committed to take care about the health of the students and the staff. In this regard, Health Centre is maintained exclusively for students and staff of the college to facilitate timely services to the needy. Apart from this, it makes a routine medical check up of the students in each academic year and advices them on their general maintenance of the health. Dr. Anand Pandurangi a renowned psychiatrist of Dharwad also attends to the student problems who are under immense stress.
